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Session Overview

Beyond funding, the State provides a wide range of tools intended to support communities in implementing projects funded by the State and Federal government. Support and assistance range from judicial streamlining and minority contracting requirements, to providing technical assistance and establishing interagency working groups to track and streamline project design, permitting, and construction phases. Often, however, awareness of and access to these opportunities is limited, leading to inequitable outcomes. This session provides a quick overview of near-term and future State resources that aim to increase access, streamline processes, and support local governments, non-profits, and minority businesses to receive and better implement State and Federal support.
