Session Overview

This session will be a group discussion on real time learning and recommendations with other leaders across the state. This work requires action by all leaders across a broad spectrum of organizations to make progress on climate change and resilience. Tribal Nations, small organizations and medium-sized organizations play a key role at the nexus of community development and climate change and have the relations and trust to build enduring physical and social infrastructure. However, institutional and governmental processes prioritize larger organizations with the resources and capacity and visibility. This session will explore what we all need to do differently to change our processes, policies and practices to build a vibrant ecosystem that nourishes and supports tribal nations, small organizations and medium-sized organizations to improve conditions and opportunities in communities across the state.
